

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS 19th April 2024

Welcome back to a brand-new term! It has been a glorious week and the weather, text-book perfect!

Year 3T led us in prayer this week reminding us to 'shine' for the good of others in our community. For almost a decade, I was involved in co-ordinating and chaperoning enthusiastic, called to action Shalom senior students who gave of their September holidays to help run Edmund Rice Camps at Chaverim. These camps aren't widely advertised, as primary age students are chosen from the Bundaberg community, who need a holiday due to a myriad of reasons. Shalom students were trained and prepared to be the best 'Big Buddies' for these little campers and it certainly was an opportunity for them to 'shine' for the good of our local Bundaberg community. They were excellent role models for these young boys and girls, who were often experiencing hardship. Happily, Shalom students went on to volunteer for these camps long after they left the College in leadership roles and a few are on St. Patrick's staff, as educators, today. These camps were named after Blessed Edmund Ignatius Rice, who was a Roman Catholic missionary and educationalist who first looked out one of the early Catholic foundational schools and pondered how he could use the facilities for the poor, whilst not being utilised. He then built on this idea and welcomed those born into poverty by dressing, feeding and educating them, alongside the privileged for the growth and benefit of all in the community. I visited his first school, when in Ireland and it had a bakery and tailor's room to ensure no one was disadvantaged.

Over the holidays, St. Patrick's experienced its first Vacation Care which was an absolute success. It reminded me of the Edmund Rice Story. Schools are soulless places during holiday periods and it was wonderful to hear young children laughing, exploring and making the most of our beautiful grounds and facilities. We had convincing numbers each day and I'd like to congratulate Team OSHC for an excellent start, for what I expect to be a long affiliation, for the good of our working families.

We are equally as blessed to have the Church on our campus. We utilise this connectedness to attend Class Masses and our students make up the largest portion of children presently preparing to make their Sacraments in the Bundaberg region. I really enjoy seeing so many little St. Patty's faces at the 9am Sunday Mass, especially when I am on Children's Liturgy. On Sunday, the 28th April at 9am, Fr. Don has invited us to be involved in the first Children's Mass for 2024 at our very own slice of the parish in Power's Street. If you haven't yet been to explore this part of our campus, we very much welcome St. Patrick's families to join us for Mass and a shared morning tea will follow. It will be wonderful to see some of our own students taking on ministries that weekend.

For the above-mentioned reasons, I am grateful for the opportunity for us to make the most of all St. Patrick's has to offer in recent times. Edmund Rice reminds us that children are our best investment for a bright future when he suggests 'Have courage; the good seed will grow up in the children's hearts later on' and Luke (18:16) reminds us of Jesus' directive to welcome and 'let the children come' so I hope to see as many students as possible there.

BOOKCLUB




Book club catalogues were sent home with your child last week.

All other students will be advised of their final position in the race on the day. A warm invitation is open to all interested parents to support their child/children during this event. Approximate times have been outlined above, although please understand that there may be a need for flexibility with these times. Parking will only be made available in the Arts Precinct carpark (the first carpark to the left off Brother Hogan Drive). Please note the Staff toilets in the Shalom Sports Centre will be available to adults on the day. The toilet facilities in the 'Hangar' Sports Shed are for student use.
