

PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

9th February 2024

This week 5M led us in prayer around the theme 'peace'. I know from my time at Shalom (the Hebrew word for peace) we tried often to articulate the true meaning of this special word for students. It is built from a root denoting wholeness or completeness, but I often found it difficult to explain what that might look like, let alone taste like. The Year 5 students did an amazing job this week helping us to understand this term a little more deeply. They described 'peace' as feeling like a warm hug from Mum and suggested if it was a food it might taste like vanilla ice-cream. They also shared the prayer below which beautifully encapsulates a true sense of what 'peace' might look like in action.

Peace

Peace is calmness, peace is quietness,
Peace is love and gentleness,
Peace is gladness, peace is goodness.
Peace is joy and happiness.
Peace is loving, peace is helping
Peace is showing that you care.
Peace is sharing, peace is giving
Peace is joining hands in prayer.

This week I have felt a strong sense of peace from each corner of our school. The year has started very well and I just feel that there is a great feeling in the air at St. Patrick's. Several school staff members have started the ritual of attending the short, simple, yet reflective 7am Thursday morning Mass at St. Patrick's church, followed by a cup of coffee from visiting coffee van. Please feel free to join us! All welcome! Fr. Don's Homily touched on a similar theme and made me reflect on how lucky we are to live in a fairly peaceful part of the world, despite some frightening events that have unfolded over recent weeks, a lot closer to home. Pope Francis (2014) suggests that Justice and Peace start at home. This message resonates with me. We can often feel powerless to make a difference to peace on the world stage, but we all have the power to impact our own family's sense of peace and consequently our St. Patrick's School community. Pope Francis would suggest this a building block for 'a world that respects each other, accepts others in their diversity and takes care of each other. This is not always easy and sometimes hard to achieve even in our own backyards, but worth working towards and I can see the fruits of the work you do with your own children in the way they have started this year, so THANK YOU!

Last year it was wonderful to have the opportunity to come together as a Parents and Friends group to listen to Justin Coulson (Semester 1) and to learn about the Zones of Regulations (Semester 2) which is heavily used to regulate behaviour at St. Patrick's. I hope some of these strategies are assisting parents, as they navigate their way through their children's daily lives. Over the break, I spent some time working my way through some wonderful suggestions made by parents for future topics. Parents suggested ideas and strategies to use at home to strengthen their child's grasp of numeracy and literacy and these are the topics we have chosen.


On Monday students will receive their small donation boxes to take home and find a few coins to put in it during Lent. Our first Lent challenge will be announced next week.



SPORTS NEWS

BUNDABERG DISTRICT U12 SCHOOL SPORTS TRIALS-2024

Trial information will be advised in the school's newsletter each week detailing trial information for upcoming individual and team events.

Gaining selection in a Bundaberg District Team is the first step on the pathway to representing Wide Bay and Queensland. To represent Bundaberg District, students must be born 2012, 2013 & 2014 (only exceptional 10 year old students will be given permission to trial in team sports). The majority of team sport trials occur in February and March.

Please be aware of the following points:

- Team sports are selected in an U12 category and it is very unlikely that a 10 year old student would be selected, with the exception of Rugby League. Rugby League selects students in U10, U11 and U12 categories due to the contact nature of the sport.
- Bundaberg District trials are not 'have a go' trials. St Patrick's has a responsibility for sending students who we feel display high ability in the chosen sport and a high level of behaviour.
- Students wishing to trial must have a consent form issued by the school with authorisation from Mr Plumb, Ms Gollshewsky or Annette Hammermeister. Students will not be able to participate in the trials without a *Bundaberg District Primary Schools nomination form*.
- · Cross Country and Athletics nominations will be made by the school after our school carnivals. Swimming & Aquathlon are the exceptions Wide Bay School Sport are responsible for the selection of these teams.
