### PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

### 15th March 2024

This week we enter the 5<sup>th</sup> week of Lent. At Mass on the weekend, it was wonderful to see familiar faces in the students who are presently preparing to make their sacraments. They would have noticed how we exited in silence, with no music. Lent is a time of somber reflection. A time to stop, let go of negative influences in our life and prepare for the renewed growth promised in celebration of the Easter season. I remember reading some time ago, a message from Rabbi Harold Kushner challenging us to reframe life events (good and bad) in a way that we see God's fingerprints all over them. He posed that in life it is easy to find God in the sunsets or a happy occasion, but suggested when we start to see 'God's fingerprints' on everyday occurrences, we begin to broaden our perspectives. This reminds me of Jesus' death and resurrection. Such a tragedy, yet viewed through this lens, a juxtaposition, resulting in the 2024 years of revelation and learning that has followed.

This week I took this advice and Year Two's who asked us to 'look for something special in each person around us' reminding us that God has his fingerprints firmly planted on this community. It started in inviting and welcoming Mr. John Campbell, Primary Mathematics consultant from DCEO Rockhampton, to share his knowledge with teachers, parents and some students. It was a wonderful opportunity to catch up with some of our supportive parents who are keen to connect with the school for the betterment of their children. Then we joined together with St. Jospeh's and St. Mary's to share best practice, Tuesday afternoon, which affirmed the strong relationships we enjoy with our brother and sister school. St. Patrick's Day was also full of golden moments, beginning with a thought-provoking Liturgy, the badging of our House Captains and a whole lot of 'St. Patrick's Day' magic throughout the day.

Then we had to dig a little deeper to see the God like moments that were born from NAPLAN. Some children saw this as an opportunity to throw themselves in to an opportunity to show growth or areas of challenge, taking the task in their stride. Others may have seen this as a less favourable experience. However, I could see God's mark on this annual event, as I noted the comradery of Year 3's and 5's, along with the love and support of their teachers. Any time we are pushed out of our comfort zone, we are sure to grow, and this builds resilience, when delivered through a safe and supportive environment. NAPLAN finishes Monday and I would like to thank Mrs. Jo Driver and the Year Three and Five Teachers for preparing students so well for this assessment, which gives a 'snapshot' of where students are operating at this one narrow point in time.

In the week that follows, let's us all try to see 'God's Fingerprints' not purely through the beautiful things evolving from life, but also the messy ones.



# VACATION CARE OPENING SOON



St. Patrick's Catholic Primary School Bundaberg Outside School Hours Care (OSHC) is excited to announce the launch of our Vacation Care program in 2024 during the Easter School Holidays.

The program will be operational from 7:00 am to 6:00 pm and will cost \$59 per day.

The Vacation Care program will be published through Xplor Comms function in week 7 of each school term. Once released, families can commence booking through the Xplor Parents App. In week 8, the program opens to the wider school community and other schools.

Assistance is available through Centrelink to help you with the cost of childcare. To receive the subsidy\*, you must care for a child 13 or younger who's not attending secondary school, unless an exemption applies. You must also use an approved childcare service, be responsible for paying the childcare fees, and meet residency and immunisation requirements.

\*Childcare subsidy is calculated from the Vacation care daily fee \$59 - CCS% = Gap fee paid by parent







To get Childcare Subsidy (CCS), create a myGov account and link it to Centrelink. Here are the steps to create a myGov account:

- 1. Go to myGov and select Create account.
- 2. Select Continue with email.
- 3. Read the privacy notice and Terms of use.
  - If you understand and agree to the Terms of use, select Next.
- 1. Enter an Email address and select Next.
- 2. Enter the Code sent to your email, then select Next.
- 3. Enter your Mobile number (optional) and select Next.
- 4. Enter the Code sent to your mobile phone and select Next.
- 5. Enter a Password and then Re-enter password.
- 6. Create your 3 Secret questions and answers. Choose from the list or create your own.
