



PRINCIPAL'S NEWS

Last week, I mentioned how reading is not only a vehicle that leads us to devour knowledge, but can also bolster relationships. This was evident at our 'reading on the deck' activity last week. It was wonderful to see so many grandparents, parents, teachers and peers share reading, whilst enjoying sunshine and fresh air. Reading at night, in a relaxed environment is just as powerful. I made mention of one quote shared by Year 5T at Courtyard Prayer, but there were more;

Elyse—*'It has been a terrible, horrible, no good, very bad day. My mom says some days are like that'* Judith Viorst-Alexander and the Terrible, Horrible, No Good, Very Bad Day.

Summer—*'unless someone like you cares a whole awful lot, nothing is going to get better, it's not'* Dr. Seuss-The Lorax

Ben—*'You can't stay in your corner of the forest waiting for others to come to you. You have to go to them sometimes'* – A. Milne-Winnie-the Pooh.

Authors have an impressive way of taking life lessons and weaving them into narratives, sandwiched between colourful covers and creative literary devices. Junior Fiction is especially effective when used to teach young students about relationships and how to deal with inevitable conflict. When I was younger, I remember if I went home to complain about an issue, my mother's advice would be, 'don't involve adults in your friendship conflicts, as children get over it and move on, adults don't'. In hindsight this was sensible advice, as I did work through these issues and developed skills to solve conflict on my own. In my line of work, I have often witnessed this to be true. Caring, supportive parents come forward with their child's problem, then upon investigation, the students have long moved on. I have also been the emotive parent, paining for my children if they ever had to encounter a friendship fall out. Despite having my mother's advice in the back of my mind, I also wanted to protect my children. Add digital platforms to the mix and issues become complicated and as parents, we walk this tight rope, trying to know when to step forward and when to step back.

Justin Coulson (2018) suggests that every parent with more than one child-in fact every human in a relationship -will experience some form of conflict. He goes on to name 'empathy' as the key to resolving conflict. When a child can gain insight into a reason why their sibling or peer behave in the way they do, they may recognise the part they have played in the problem, therefore gaining insight to the impact their actions have on others. This is why we try to solve issues restoratively where possible. It is a very powerful tool when students are given the time and space, to discuss how another's actions have made them react and to express how situations have made them feel. This is also true for adults. Kaitlyn from 5T's quote really resonated with me—*'You must never feel bad about making mistakes...as long as you take the trouble to learn from them'* Norton Juster-The Phantom Tollbooth. This week Year 5 ventured out to partake in their camp at Chaverim. The feedback would suggest that the Year Five co-hort took on the messages they shared in last week's Courtyard Prayer, as there was plenty of team building, problem solving and ultimately relationship building witnessed. A big thank you to our Chaverim friends, Andrea Tindall, Mellisa Doyle, Larisa Green, Jo Driver, Tracey Cook, Cristian Zandona, Leah Walton, Clare Clarke and Annette Hammermeister, who were all involved in camp in some capacity.


